

WHO can become a member of VMCTA?

Membership is available to anyone who is interested in the offices of Municipal Clerk or Treasurer.

VMCTA offers three categories of membership

Active: An individual who is currently serving, by appointment or election, as Clerk, Treasurer, Assistant Clerk or Assistant Treasurer, in a town, school district, city, village or county of the State of Vermont.

Retired: Upon leaving the public sector or changing duties within it, an individual who has previously been an active member in good standing may continue membership in the Association under this classification.

Honorary: Honorary membership shall be held as an exclusive distinction for meritorious services in the furtherance of the Association. Honorary membership is the highest distinction that the Association may bestow in exceptional cases.

WHAT is the Vermont Municipal Clerks' and Treasurers' Association?

The Vermont Municipal Clerks' and Treasurers' Association (VMCTA) is a professional non-profit organization which:

- Promotes a closer working relationship between Municipal Clerks and Treasurers around the State.
- Provides a medium for exchanging ideas.
- Promotes uniformity in carrying out the duties of Clerks and Treasurers.
- Provides education and training through First Thursday virtual trainings, the Spring Fundamentals workshops, the Fall Conference, and mentorship sessions.
- Fosters and encourages a higher degree of professionalism among Clerks and Treasurers.
- Reviews and introduces legislation in the Vermont General Assembly that affects its members; hires a professional lobbyist.



WHAT SERVICES does VMCTA provide?

VMCTA is committed to educating and broadening the skillsets of Clerks and Treasurers through:

Education: We offer certification seminars aimed at promoting high standards of professionalism and uniformity between Municipal Clerks and Treasurers throughout the State, which enhances the level of service to our communities.

Scholarships: Through an application process, VMCTA awards scholarships for attendance at the VMCTA Annual Meeting, New Clerk & Treasurer / Annual Spring Training, and the New England Association of City & Town Clerks (NEACTC) annual conference. More information at scholarship@vmcta.org.

Email Listserv: VMCTA maintains its own electronic mailing list for members to discuss topics of common interest. This listserv is available to members only.

Mentorship: VMCTA keeps a current list of Clerks and Treasurers who want to support their colleagues through mentorship. We will help connect you with a clerk or treasurer who has similar issues, municipal size, and/or services (i.e. hospital town/city).

Annual Meeting: The Annual Business Meeting is held in September each year to elect Association officers, establish legislative priorities, and conduct other business as necessary. This meeting and associated trainings provide an excellent opportunity to network with your colleagues and associates.
